## Weekly Reflection ~August 5 18th Sunday of Ordinary Time

The reading from Exodus recounts how unhappy the Israelites were about their situation. Even though they had escaped the slavery in Egypt, the hardships of their journey discouraged them. They focused on what they had lost and blamed Moses for their problems.

It is a human tendency to focus on our problems and seek to blame someone. Every day we have to make choices. Most of them are small things: when to get up, what to eat, what to wear, how to do our job, etc. They are our choices and they have consequences that may seem good or bad at the time. The "secret" is to learn to focus on our blessings, seek the Spirit's guidance in making choices (even small ones) and look for the lessons that the consequences are teaching us. Wishing for the past and seeking to blame others gets us no
